

President's Letter

Annual Meeting Chairman Andy Merryman has put together a terrific agenda of activities starting with tours of Big Sur and the Monterey Aquarium on Saturday, June 6th. Monday afternoon activities on the 8th include bike and kayak tours; golf; and tours of Cannery Row, the wine country and Carmel antique stores. As in the past, a welcome reception will be held Sunday evening and the dinner and awards banquet will be held Monday night. Technical Program Chairman Bernie Brauer has put together an outstanding mix of speakers and panel discussions with a focus on valuation issues. The 3-hour workshop will examine three primary topics but will cover any issue that arises. The three primary topics are:

What is Reasonable Certainty and is it the same as 90% Probability?

What are Current Economics Conditions and how do I apply them when I find out?

Are Reserves derived from escalated cashflows Proved or Unproved?

The workshop will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on May 13th. A chapter meeting will be held prior to the workshop to discuss issues of interest and to introduce new and prospective members. The chapter is also in the process of preparing an informational pamphlet on California oil for distribution at the Annual Meeting in Monterey.


