

## News From the SPE


The SPE sponsored a successful Hydrocarbon Economics and Evaluation Seminar in Dallas during March. The seminar was followed by a two-day Workshop on Probabilistic Assessment of Reserves. This too was well attended, and participants had generally positive comments. There will be another workshop in July, with a slightly different format designed to allow more audience participation.


