# SPEE-SEC FORUM IN HOUSTON

October 23, 2001

A capacity crowd of approximately 120 people attended the second annual SPEE Forum dedicated to a better understanding of U.S. SEC Reserves Definitions and Reporting Requirements. Both Jim Murphy and Ron Winfrey participated on behalf of the SEC.

Both SEC engineers reminded the audience that they did not speak on behalf of the SEC Commissioners but were providing their opinions about compliance with the SEC Reserves Definitions.

Some seven "cases" were presented to illustrate numerous circumstances related to categorization of reserves quantities. These cases and presenters are described below:

- Updip Reserves/Test Requirements
   Presented by Mike Heinz (for Carter Henson)
- 2. Petroleum Fiscal Systems
  Presented by Tom Gardner
- 3. Coal Bed Methane Project Development Presented by Leslie O'Connor
- 4. Seismic Based Reserves
  Presented by Rudy Wildenstein
- Russian Proved Undeveloped Locations Presented by Tom Gardner (for Larry Nelms)
- 6. Reservoir Simulation
  Presented by Robert Rasor
- Deepwater Projects
   Presented by Bob Wagner

Each presenter noted several decision options during his/her presentation and solicited SEC responses as well as audience participation. Much of the discussion time was related to the SEC's position that proved undeveloped locations be limited to one "offset" from a commercial well unless there is "certainty" of "continuity of production" beyond such offsets.

On another topic, the SEC engineers repeated their continuing position on the need for "compelling evidence" to support proved reserves designations when the applicant is relying upon seismic interpretations or other information to determine proved reservoir limits.

Attendees were provided a binder containing copies of Power Point slides for all seven cases, SPE/WPC Reserves Definitions, SEC Reserves Definitions and a CD-Rom containing the presentation cases. Forum evaluation forms were provided for attendees to record their comments about the Forum and to make suggestions for improvements.

The Forum was directed by Ron Harrell, Chairman of the Forum Steering Committee. Other members of the Committee were Chuck Brittan, Tom Gardner, Dan Olds, Danny Simmons and Marilyn Wilson.

The Case Committee consisted of Tom Gardner, Chair, Carter Henson and Robert Rasor. Special appreciation is extended to B. K. Buongiorno for her dedication and hard work in managing the invitation and reservation process and in making the Forum a huge success.




