Calgary

A virtual online Business Meeting was held on October 19, 2021 with 22 members in attendance. The Chairman opened the meeting by inviting comments from all in memory of Walter Wright. Minutes of the May 25th meeting were approved and the Treasurer's report was presented. The Distinguished Member Bursary is now \$101,755 (includes July 2021 \$20,000 Chapter donation increase) and would provide \$3,500 to \$4,000 annually to a qualifying student. Only one application was received for the Annual Donation so the decision to select a candidate has been deferred to search for another candidate. The Membership and International BOD reports were presented. Members were reminded to vote for International BOD candidates. The status of updates to COGEH was discussed.

Discussions with SPEE Calgary and the Alberta Securities Commission continue to address including by-products and non-hydrocarbons (specifically Hydrogen and Helium) as Product Types within NI51-101 and COGEH. Other COGEH issues include inactive well operating costs; changes to abandonment costs which are tied to the definition of "property," and clarity on carbon taxes. The COGEH Update Committee is hoping to sort these out for next year's annual updates.

We are scheduling our next Technical meeting on November 16 as an in-person session (Woohoo!) with a presentation by Bryce Kalynchuk, Rose & Associates, on *How not to Squander Billions*. As restrictions continue to relax, we hope to continue with all meetings reverting to in-person but may include a hybrid session as we all adjust.

California

The California Chapter Chair participated in the August 24th "Chapter Roundtable Discussion" and expressed problems facing the California Chapter with low membership and lack of meetings. ExCom and other Chapter Chairs invited California Chapter members to remotely join in their monthly meetings as made available. The California Chair provided California

members with the contact information for all SPEE Chapter Chairs citing specific invitations from Dallas, Denver, and Houston to join their meetings remotely. The email also reminded members that information on all Chapter meetings can be found on the SPEE website. We hope that this will help the California Chapter members feel more engaged with SPEE as a whole. I appreciate all the help and invitations from the other Chapters and the ExCom.

An area of concern in California is continued excessive regulation and legislation and lack of existing regulatory administration by California Geologic Energy Management Division (CalGEM). California Governor Newsome is an open opponent of fossil fuel extraction and use in the state. This permeates throughout all state regulatory agencies such as air boards, water boards, forestry, fish and game, coastal commission, etc.

Dallas

The Dallas Chapter held four meetings virtually in 2021 which have been well attended. On September 9th, Jennifer Fitzgerald, P.E., Occidental Petroleum Corporation, presented Rethinking an Industry Recommended Practice: Lessons being Learned from Monograph 5 (Type Well Profiles). Total registration was 173 including 122 non-members. The Dallas Chapter's next meeting will be held on November 9 and we are currently working with SPE to do a joint virtual presentation on Ethics to be held in early December.

To address concerns regarding COVID-19, we have been providing our virtual meetings free of charge to all attendees since early 2020. As a result, we have noticed an increase in the number of attendees due to the ease of access to our virtual offerings, and plan to continue offering virtual attendance once we begin in-person meetings.

In an effort to offer members exclusive benefits, the Dallas SPEE Chapter has a tentative evening happy hour/networking event scheduled for May 2022.

The Denver Chapter held its second post-pandemic in-person meeting on October 13th. Jess Barhaug from Great Western Petroleum presented to a crowd of 47 on Integrated Learnings from DJ Basin Science Pads: Using Reservoir Characterization to Optimize Spacing and Completions. We've also restarted in-person social events, hosting a Summer Soiree on September 23rd with a Membership Workshop planned for November 12th. Our final meeting of 2021 will be an ethics workshop on December 8th.

Europe

The Europe Chapter held a meeting on May 20th with Greg. Birrell, CENG. MEI presenting A Study of Proved Reserve Categorization in SEC Filings in which he discussed statistical techniques for evaluating whether a reserve evaluator has made an appropriate estimate of the volume uncertainty. The technique uses a statistical study of technical revisions over time to determine whether an initial booking had the correct probability of being exceeded by future production. Results were presented for 20 proved reserve filings to the SEC to determine if the original filing conformed to the spirit of the definition of reasonable certainty.

On the June 24th Chapter meeting Tom Gunningham, Director of Reservoir Engineering, Rockflow Resources Ltd presented Resource Aggregation: When Two Fields are Better than One. Tom looked at the complexities of reserve determination for fields which are related in some way, such as fields which share infrastructure or costs.

All our meetings in 2021 are available to share with other chapters and are on the SPEE website.

The Europe Chapter has recently purchased audiovisual equipment to allow more of a blend of remote and physical attendees, prior to our first physical meeting on November 24th. We hope this will allow attendees who are unable to travel to London to actively participate in Chapter meetings. Through increased attendance at our chapter meetings we hope to generate additional revenue for the Chapter.

Since the summer break, the Houston chapter convened webinars via Zoom to host two distinguished speakers. In September, Steven Beck, Project Engineer at Ryder Scott Company in the Integrated Services division, presented A Breakdown of the Carbon Capture

Value Chain. In October, Dr. John Lee presented What Would Arps Think About What We Have Done to His Decline Model? The November speaker will be Justin Hayes from Bedrock Energy Partners to discuss Spacing Ourselves to Death. All events since the summer have been sponsored by TRC Consultants L.C. All webinars from Houston have been open to international chapter members. Non-members of any kind are required to pay a \$15/event fee.

Current member count stands at 163 and therefore we are looking into boosting membership by reaching out via hosting happy hours and having a booth or speaking at other larger conferences (i.e. URTec) to promote the organization.

The Houston Chapter committed \$4,000 of scholarship money to four Texas schools.

We plan to resume short courses in the summer of 2022, starting with Monograph 4.

Raised in Calgary, Alberta, by Walter and Mae Wright, Walter grew up in the Mission area of Calgary where he attended Western Canada High School. After high school, he entered Mount Royal College's Petroleum Engineering transfer program that led him to the Oklahoma University where he completed his degree with a B.Sc. In Petroleum Engineering.

Upon completion of his degree, Walter began work with Chevron Canada. Over his 20-some years with Chevron, Walter worked many places in western Canada including Virden, Manitoba; and Edmonton, Red Deer and Calgary, Alberta. It was while working in Edmonton that Walter met his wife Sheila.

After Chevron, Walter joined the Bank of Montreal as the Vice President of the Oil and Gas Department. He travelled the world in that capacity, including the United States, United Kingdom, Japan and Australia to name a few and Sheila would occasionally join him on these junkets. While at the bank, Walter was a founding member of the Calgary Chapter of the Society of Petroleum Evaluation Engineers.

Global Climate Talks - COP26

The following information is from the UN Climate Action website.¹ While it is not SPEE news, it is included in this newsletter because it likely will have an impact on the oil and gas industry as governments take action to reduce the impact of climate change.

The 26th and latest round of global climate talks is taking place from October 31 to November 12, 2021, in Glasgow, Scotland. Thousands of government delegates and people from civil society, business and the media will gather to advance climate action. The world will be watching and demanding that national leaders rise to the moment, given the mounting climate crisis and far-reaching consequences for a livable future.

What is COP?

COP stands for the conference of the Parties to the 1992 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, which set the stage for all international cooperation on climate. The COP is the top decision-making body for implementing the Convention and follow-up instruments like the 2015 Paris Agreement. Generally meeting once a year, the COP reviews national reports on emissions reductions and other climate measures.

What's at stake?

COP26 must be a turning point. It must deliver bold, large-scale and rapid actions by national leaders, for people and the planet. Countries must come together and collaborate to rebuild trust, re-energize action, and deliver in full on the promises made in the Paris Agreement.

Three top priorities are:

- 1. Keep global temperature rise to no more than 1.5 degrees Celsius through rapid, bold emissions cuts and net-zero commitments.
- 2. Increase international finance for adaptation to at least half the total spent on climate action.
- Meet the existing commitment to provide \$100 billion in international climate finance each year so that developing countries can invest in green technologies, and protect lives and livelihoods against worsening climate impacts.
